## **CAMPERS' RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

To ensure a successful camp experience for all, please discuss the following with your camper:

### **Principles of Conduct:**

- Campers and counselors learn to respect the rights of other children.
- Campers and counselors play constructively with other children.
- Campers and counselors follow safety rules.
- All counselors are at Camp to support and encourage campers at all times.
- A child should always feel that he can address any of his concerns with any counselor.
- Each camper will develop an awareness of the rights, needs and privileges of others, and will work cooperatively with other children and with his counselors.
- Nobles Day Camp expects cooperative and courteous behavior and language from each camper, and requires it from each counselor. Mutual respect is at the heart of the successful camping experience.
- Nobles Day Camp expects cooperative and courteous behavior and language from each camper, and requires it from each counselor. Mutual respect is at the heart of the successful camping experience.
- Many high risk activities have limits of the number of campers who can attend each hour. Campers who cannot attend on one occasion will usually have the opportunity to participate the next time it is available.
- Campers respect each others privacy.
- Nobles Day Camp encourages children to make new friends and expand their circle of acquaintances.

*\*The Director reserves the right to dismiss a camper when, in her opinion, this action is in the best interest of the camp.*

*Behavior that warrants discipline is managed through our Behavioral Management Plan, ie: time out, send camper to the Director's office, call home, etc. Available on our website.*

*Nobles Day Camp strictly follows:*

- Corporal punishment, including spanking, is prohibited.
- No camper shall be subjected to cruel or severe punishment, humiliation, or verbal abuse.
- No camper shall be denied food, water or shelter.
- No child shall be punished for soiling, wetting or not using the toilet.

## GENERAL CAMPER INFORMATION

### WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

*Camper's name and group must appear on all belongings including clothing, lunch boxes, bathing suits, swim caps, towels, backpacks, etc.*

#### • **TWO FACE MASKS - LABELED**

- A water bottle EVERYDAY.
- One or two bathing suits
- Bathing cap or hair ties for any child with long hair
- When travelling to pool, we recommend Flip flops, Crocs or Water Shoes. Water shoes may be worn in the pool.
- 1-2 inexpensive towels daily for swim (should go home each afternoon).
- Goggles (optional – swim masks not allowed)
- Bring lunch every day in a cooler or lunch box (unless participating in our optional lunch program) except on cookout days (Friday).
- Adequate rain gear on rainy days.
- A change of clothing and a sweatshirt
- 2 Containers of Sunscreen of at least SPF25\*  
Hats and swimshirts are a good option if your child is particularly sensitive to the sun.
- Extra insect repellent\*

\* Please note sunscreen and bug spray should be applied **prior to** the camper's arrival at camp. Campers will be assisted or reminded to reapply sunscreen as needed throughout the day. Campers can not share each others' sunscreen or bug spray, due to allergic and skin reactions.

### VISITING CAMP

- Visitors (including parents) are limited to dropping off or picking up campers or any official camp or medical needs.
- **Thank you for your cooperation!**

Parents have the right to review background check, health care and discipline policies, our behavior management plan, and our grievance procedures upon request.

Nobles Day Camp is in compliance with regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (105 CMR 430) and licensed by the Town of Dedham Board of Health. Information on these regulations may be obtained at 781.751.9220.

### WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP

- Personal sports equipment.
- Toys, dolls, and stuffed animals.
- Live animals of any kind.
- Toys which in any way resemble or might be mistaken for any kind of weapon; this includes squirt guns!
- Trading Cards
- Weapons of any kind
- Alcohol, drugs and tobacco of any kind, including marijuana, e-cigarettes and any vaping devices.
- Electronic games.
- iPods, cameras, cell phones.
- Money in any form.
- Group snacks or special treats.
- The Camp assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to camper's personal property.

**To prevent injury, all campers must wear sneakers (closed protective footwear).**

# COMMUNICATION

## PRIOR TO CAMP

Most camp communication is sent via e-mail. Please be sure your e-mail information is up to date. The following forms and documents are needed for camp. Many are accessible via your CampinTouch account:

- Bus Transportation (based on availability)
- Lunch (must register no later than the week prior to attendance))
- Extended Day  
(AM, PM care and Stay and Play)

Please check this account regularly. You can also see your billing information at any time under the Financial Management Heading.

## **AUTHORIZED GROWN UPS**

All parents are required to list Authorized Grown-Ups in their Cariina account.

- List any driver (other than yourself) who may pick up your child(ren). You can add/remove drivers at any time.

Your child's group assignment and schedule will be emailed directly to you in early June.

## DURING CAMP

A positive camp experience can only happen with open communication. Please feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns as soon as they arise.

- The head counselor of your child's group will call you within the first week of arrival giving you the opportunity to ask any questions or voice any concerns.
  - When calling the Camp office, leave your name, any questions you may have, and the best time for a counselor to return your call.
  - Our staff will also contact you with any issues or concerns we may come across.
  - You will receive weekly e-mails with important information and updates. Your child's group counselors and camp photos will be posted on our website.
  - In the case of an emergency and you need to contact your child, it is important that you notify the office through your Cariina app.
  - In the event of a campus emergency (such as a tornado or hurricane) campers will go to a designated shelter for their safety. In the event of a change that would affect camper drop-off or pick-up, time or location, you will be notified with any instructions or updates by text or email message.
- Nobles Day Camp promotes "proactive" communication versus "reactive". Ultimately, it helps us provide the best camp experience we can for your child.

## **Cariina Application**

### **Transportation/Communication**

All families will be required to have an account with Cariina which will assign a unique QR code to each family which they will display upon arrival and pick-up. This is where you will easily access your daily drop off and pick up information, and communicate with Nobles for all attendance and dismissal needs. See separate Parent Cariina App Guide that was emailed to you or you may access it in your CampinTouch account.

## HEALTHCARE POLICY AND PROCEDURES

- **Nobles Day Camp Health Consultant:** Dedham Medical Associates
- We have 2 RN's and 1 Certified Athletic Trainer on duty at all times during the regular camp hours of 8:30am to 4:30pm.

**The Health History Form and updated physical must be on file before your child will be allowed to attend camp.**

- The health staff must:
  1. Evaluate.
  2. Enter into the database.
  3. Communicate necessary information to the necessary staff members.

The following procedures are mandated and strictly enforced by the Massachusetts DPH to provide the utmost safety for your child.

1. Nobles Day Camp's policy requires that each camper must have an updated annual physical examination within 18 months of camp attendance.
2. **Immunizations MUST be up to date.**
3. All campers must have emergency contact information on file.
4. If your child visits the nurse's office for any minor

injury, you will receive a written form at the end of the day informing you of the reason for the visit and what treatment/response was given. In the event of any illness symptoms which hinder the camper's ability to return to activities or a major injury, the nurse will contact you immediately (or your emergency contacts) to be picked up within the hour of the onset of illness/injury, as well as written notification of the treatment/response given.

5. All campers must have a health history form completed on an annual basis by their parent/guardian. It is critical that these forms be kept up-to-date.
6. All campers must carry accident insurance to cover injuries that might occur at camp. The camp does not provide such coverage. The insurance provider and policy number must be documented on the Health History form. This will expedite medical treatment if a camper requires such attention. In the event that a family does not have medical insurance, all costs will be directly billed to the family.
7. Please review the separate Nobles Day Camp COVID-19 Policies and Procedures which will be emailed to you and also available on our website.

## MEDICATION POLICY\*

- All prescription and over the counter medication (not listed in the Health History Form) **MUST** be administered at camp with an original physician's order and signed parental consent (use the Medication Administration Form). This is available on our web site and your CampinTouch account (Forms & Documents).
- A parent/guardian/designated adult must hand-deliver any medication to a health professional in a sealed, original pharmacy container, in a Ziploc bag with camper's name, group and weeks clearly marked on the outside. Ask the pharmacist for an extra labeled bottle for use at camp.
- All medications are kept in the health office under supervision of the camp nurses. Exceptions may be made if deemed appropriate by a physician's order and /or consultation with parent and camp nurse.
- The nurse or camp personnel designated by the nurse are responsible for releasing all medication.

*\*Helpful Hint: Monday mornings are extremely busy. We recommend you hand deliver all medication to our health professionals the week **before** your child's camp experience.*

Massachusetts General Laws (Chapter 76, Sec. 15) requires full immunization prior to starting camp. A signed immunization certificate (often a computer printout) from a physician must include month, day and year of immunizations. Specific information in regards to immunizations is available on the Commonwealth of Massachusetts web site. Exception is allowed only on certification of medical inadvisability or objection on religious grounds.

## NOBLES DAY CAMP ATTENDANCE POLICY

This year, children may not be sent to camp with the following symptoms even without a fever (please see our COVID-19 Policies and Procedures):

- Runny nose and/or mild cough
- Vague complaints of aches, pains or fatigue
- Single episode of diarrhea or vomiting without a fever
- Ear infections
- Sore throat with hoarse voice and/or cough

Children ***should not come*** to camp and will be asked to go home if they exhibit any of the following symptoms:

- **ANTIBIOTIC TREATMENT:** any child receiving antibiotics must have received at least 24 hours of treatment before returning to camp
- **APPEARANCE, BEHAVIOR:** unusually fatigued, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to awaken, confused and/or irritable.
- **EYES:** thick mucus/pus draining from one/both eyes or "pink eye"(with conjunctivitis there may be a white or yellow discharge, matted eyelids after sleep, eye pain and/or redness.)
- **FEVER:** temperature of 100 ° F or greater. NOTE: *child must be fever free for 24 hours WITHOUT MEDICATION i.e. Ibuprofen, Motrin, Advil, Tylenol, Acetaminophen etc.*
- **SORE THROAT:** particularly with fever and/or swollen glands in the neck should be evaluated by a healthcare provider. NOTE: *If the child has strep they must be on antibiotics for a full 24 hours before returning to camp.*
- **DIARRHEA:** 3 or more watery stools in a 24-hour period.
- **VOMITING:** 2 or more times within the past 24 hours.
- **RASH:** body rash accompanied by fever and/or itching.
- **LICE/SCABIES:** If your child has an active case of either, parents must confer with the Camp Nurse prior to attending camp.
- **CHICKEN POX:** children must stay home for 5 days following the onset of blisters or until all pox are scabbed over and dry
- Any COVID-19 Symptoms

Please remember that bringing a child to camp with symptoms of a potentially infectious illness puts other children and staff at risk for becoming ill.

In the case of a life threatening emergency, 9-1-1 will be directly contacted by Nobles Day Camp. The Parent/Guardian or the Emergency Contact will be contacted as soon as possible to alert you of the situation and where to meet your camper.

### ATTENDANCE

- Attendance is taken daily in each group at the beginning of the day.
- If your child is going to miss a day, please send a notification through the Cariina app.
- If a camper is absent without contacting the camp, the camp office will call the camper's family to confirm absence and the reason.
- COVID-19 Policies and Procedures will be in practice this summer.

## LUNCH

Campers have the option to purchase a lunch or bring their own picnic lunch to camp.

- If your child has any special dietary restrictions, please be sure to include the information on the medical form.
- Due to numerous dietary restrictions, we can not accept group snacks or special treats
- Nobles Day Camp supplies white or chocolate milk and water for lunch each day to all campers.
- Each Friday, we provide a cookout (hamburgers, hotdogs, veggie burgers, a piece of fruit, chips and popsicles) for all campers and staff. It is not necessary to pack a lunch that day unless your child wants their own food choice.
- We provide a morning snack for all campers. The snack menu will be posted on our website June 1st.

*A list of ingredients for campers with dietary concerns will be posted on our website.*

### LUNCH FROM HOME

- Lunch and snack items can be brought from home.
- A juice box, a piece of fruit, some cookies all make appropriate snacks and they may all be consumed in a short amount of times.
- Nobles Day Camp does not have facilities to refrigerate or microwave food. Therefore only non-perishable foods should be used in your child's lunch; a frozen pack may be included.
- You may want to consider purchasing hard-coolers vs soft pack lunch bags/boxes.

### LUNCH PURCHASED FROM CAMP (optional)

*Offered to Owl's Nest through entering 7th Grade*

- Our bagged lunches will be offered Monday through Thursday on a weekly basis. Cookout is provided for all campers on Fridays at no additional cost.
- All lunches will consist of hot entrées (i.e.: pizza, chicken fingers or grilled cheese) available every day OR a sandwich or salad and snack options (see our website for new menu options).
- You may order online on our website. We do not offer lunch Monday, July 5 and Friday, August 20. These weeks are pro-rated.
- For ordering purposes, the deadline for menu changes is one week ahead.

### NUT AWARE POLICY

Nobles Day Camp is nut aware. Simply this means Nobles Day Camp will not serve any food with peanuts or tree nuts.

We ask our campers and staff to NOT PACK PEANUT BUTTER OR ANY NUT PRODUCTS in their lunches or snacks.

Please check all food labels to be sure they do not say:

- "contains peanuts"
- "may contain peanuts"
- Sunflower butter and soy butter are great substitutions for a PB & J.
- Campers are not permitted to share or exchange food
- Snack and lunch are closely monitored
- Please label all non-packaged items
- All staff members are epi pen trained

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

### **STAY AND PLAY**

- For all Owls Nest - 2nd grade 9–2 pm campers
- Option to stay in their nests/groups until 4 pm
- Select only the days you want
- Pre-register in advance on CampinTouch or call the camp office.
- Campers remain in their groups with their counselors and friends
- Participate in free swim and an extra activity block

### **LOST & FOUND**

- All unclaimed items are collected daily and brought to the Richardson gym, near the Camp office or if your child attends the Owl's Nest program, in the Schoolhouse. You can contact the child's counselor and they can check in these areas if your child has misplaced a personal possession.
- At the conclusion of the Camp season, all items will remain available for a short time but then will be distributed to charity.

### **RAINY DAYS**

- On rainy days we will follow our regular schedule as much as possible, without compromising safety.
- Our "rainy day schedule" may change the activities offered that day. These activities will take place inside our facilities and still provide your camper with another day of great fun at Nobles Day Camp.
- Rainy days require children to be well protected as they move from one activity area to another, so proper rain gear is essential.
- Swim will be offered on warm rainy days when there is no threat of thunder and lightning.

### **CHANGE & CANCELLATION POLICIES**

- Additional weeks may be available.
- Please check with the office for availability.
- Refund Policy:

Once registration is processed, the deposit and any tuition paid is fully refundable, if enrollment changes are made by March 1st.

After March 1st, all deposits are non-refundable. We will transfer a credit of any tuition paid towards the summer of 2022.

Switching sessions is possible at any time, without penalty, as long as there is availability in the camper's age group.

Once a camper has started their session, tuition will not be pro-rated or refunded for any missed days.

Extenuating Circumstances:

We understand that at times campers may not be able to attend camp due to unforeseen hardships:

- Severe Unexpected Medical Condition
- Death in the immediate/nuclear family
- Severe Unexpected Financial Hardship

Contact the camp office should any of the above occur.

### **TUITION PAYMENTS**

Payment in full was due no later than May 12. Campers with unpaid balances will not be able to attend camp.

## **OWLS NEST at NOBLES DAY CAMP**

Owl's Nest Office Extension: 781-320-7036

For campers entering Pre-K and Kindergarten

### **PHILOSOPHY**

- Our goal in the Owl's Nest is to create a safe, happy, nurturing environment.
- The ratio of counselors to campers in each nest is one to four, enabling us to meet the individual needs of each child.
- Through encouragement and support, the children have the opportunity to develop socially and discover new ways of making friends, while participating in non-competitive activities which allow for development of their creative and physical skills.

### **COMMUNICATION**

- The head counselor of your child's nest will call you within the first week of arrival giving you the opportunity to ask any questions or voice any concerns.
- Your child will be sent home with an "Ask me about" sticker indicating something special that happened that day at camp. This is a great way to get your child talking about their camp experiences.
- Any questions or concerns may be addressed by calling the Owls Nest office or by sending a note. You can talk to the Owls Nest Coordinators or leave a message for the head counselor who will get back to you as soon as possible.

### **SCHEDULES & ACTIVITIES**

- Group schedules will be e-mailed to you by the start of camp.
- Our daily routine is structured so that there are scheduled blocks of time during the day for activities, but there is a good deal of flexibility for transitions.
- Groups rotate and have most activities 1 - 3 times per week.
- Most activities are 30 minutes in length.

### **WHAT TO BRING**

Please pack the following items clearly labeled with your child's name. The extra clothing will remain in your child's nest for the time they are enrolled at camp. In a clear plastic bag:

- Underwear, socks, t-shirt, shorts, sweatshirt.
- See *Page 2* for additional information

### **TOILETING**

- All campers must be toilet trained and self sufficient in the bathroom prior to the start of camp.
- Counselors will provide supervision, but cannot accompany campers into the bathroom stalls.

### **OWL'S NEST SWIM PROGRAM**

\*\*\*HEATED POOL\*\*\*

- The Owl's Nest swim program is tailored to the needs of each individual camper.
- Safety is the most important aspect.
- All swim staff have lifeguard and/or instructor certifications and are under the direction of the Nobles Day Camp Director and Aquatics Director.
- Each camper is evaluated and placed in the appropriate swim level to ensure quality instruction.
- Instructional swim occurs every day.
- We teach the Red Cross Preschool Aquatic Program, with various instructional flotation devices. These flotation devices are used on an as needed basis to aid proper stroke development.
- Swimming progression is a very individual endeavor. Children's skills progress differently and there is no "set" timetable to "pass" swim levels.
- No child will be pushed beyond their comfort zone.
- A progress sheet will be sent at the end of his/her camp session.
- All 9-4 campers have 2 swim times each day.

# **NOBLES DAY CAMP**

For campers entering 1st – 7th grade

## **PHILOSOPHY**

- Children make choices based on a rotating selection of activities. Children are encouraged to reach beyond familiar activities and try new ones. However, the final decision rests with the camper.
- Nobles Day Camp believes that choosing activities is a part of a child's growth and development, to encourage decision making skills and independence. This empowers campers to have some control of their own day.

## **COMMUNICATION**

- The head counselor of your child's group will call you within the first week of arrival giving you the opportunity to ask any questions or voice any concerns.
- Any questions or concerns may be addressed by calling the camp office or by sending a note. The head counselor will get back to you as soon as possible.

## **SCHEDULES & ACTIVITIES**

- Group schedules will be e-mailed to you by the start of camp.
- Some activities must limit the number of campers attending – primarily those with either limited space or controlled risk.
- If a camper is unable to attend an activity when he wishes, group counselors will assist a child in finding an alternative activity and work to assure participation the next time that activity is offered.

## **FIELD TRIPS**

Only offered to our 8th and 9th graders this year.

## **NDC SWIM PROGRAM**

**\*\*\*HEATED POOL\*\*\***

- All swim staff have lifeguard and/or instructor certifications and are under the direction of the Nobles Day Camp Director and Aquatics Director.
- The American Red Cross Learn to Swim Program, levels 1-4+, is offered.
- Each child will be evaluated on the first day they come to camp and placed in a swim group with other campers of similar age/swimming ability.
- The morning time will be instructional and all campers are required to participate.
- The afternoon swim time is a free swim environment. Campers have the option of participating or not, but the entire group must change and go to the pool area. During free swim, only campers who have demonstrated the required deep water skills may go into the designated "deep area".
- No child will be pushed beyond their comfort zone.
- Swimming progression is a very individual endeavor. Children's skills progress differently and there is no "set" timetable to "pass" swim levels.
- A progress report or level completion certificate will be sent at the end of his/her camp session.
- All 9-4 campers have two swim times each day.

**• Campers with ANY incomplete health information will not be allowed to attend camp.**

## **TEEN PROGRAM at NOBLES DAY CAMP**

NDC Office Extension: 781-320-1320

For campers entering 8th and 9th grade

### **PHILOSOPHY**

- A central focus of the Eights and Nines group philosophy is to offer more opportunities to increase personal growth, social development and leadership skills.
- Campers earn the privilege of traveling, based on their behavior in and out of camp (both with peers and staff).
- Expectations increase with each age level as more freedom AND responsibility is placed on the campers.

### **SCHEDULES & ACTIVITIES**

- Campers balance the many exciting on-campus Nobles' activity choices around their trip schedule. Group schedules will be e-mailed to you by the start of camp.
- Because traveling is a main component of this program, activities will be offered on a more limited basis than in the younger age groups.
- Eights and Nines all travel out of camp at least two times per week.
- Each group travels in a school or activity bus under close supervision of their group counselors.
- There may be an "extended" trip, departing early or coming back to camp at a later dismissal time. Please check the travel itinerary mailed to all registered campers.
- Some trips require parent signed waivers (links are in the travel itinerary).
- On Monday of each week, you will receive more detailed information regarding the itinerary and schedule of that week.
- Safety is our main concern.

### **SWIM**

- The Eights and Nines program can not offer swimming instruction due to the travel schedules.
- Free swim time is scheduled in the afternoons when the groups are not traveling.

## Directions to Nobles

### PINE STREET ENTRANCE

TRAVELING SOUTH ON RT. 128/US 95  
Take Exit 18 (Great Plain Avenue)  
At end of ramp, turn right.  
Continue one mile and bear right at St. Susanna's Church onto Pine St.  
Continue 1/4 mile to the school entrance which is on the right.

TRAVELING ON RT. 1/THE VFW PARKWAY  
Turn onto Rte.109 West (toward Dedham).  
Turn right at second traffic light onto Pine St.  
School entrance is the first left turn.

### BRIDGE STREET ENTRANCE

*(When gate is closed, please use Pine Street entrance.)*

TRAVELING NORTH ON RT. 128/US 95  
Take Exit 16A (east)  
Take Rt. 109 toward Dedham.  
Follow 109 go through one traffic light  
Cross the bridge and take sharp left onto the campus.


TRAVELING ON RT. 1/THE VFW PARKWAY
